
OUR VALUE THIS HALF TERM IS FRIENDSHIP

TAKE ONE ARTIST

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
TAKE ONE ARTIST

SCHOOL UNIFORM

Once again, I need to ask all parents to check the school uniform policy very carefully. Despite many reminders, a number of children are not wearing the correct school uniform.

If your child is not wearing the correct uniform, you will receive a reminder letter and will be expected to send your child in the correct uniform the next day.

The uniform policy clearly states that shoes MUST be ALL black and that cycling shorts or leggings must NOT be worn for PE. It is also clear that all jumpers and sweatshirts must be navy blue and that hoodies must NOT be worn.
