

Packed Lunches

Please remember, if your child brings packed lunches to school, you must ensure that they are **healthy** packed lunches. Please do **NOT** send any nuts, crisps, doughnuts, cream cakes, chocolate bars, fizzy drinks, American muffins, jam, peanut butter, chocolate spread,



fruit juices or food purchased in fast food restaurants. If you do send any of these items, your child will not be allowed to eat them and they will be sent back home with a note.
