ATTENDANCE

I am pleased to report that the current level of attendance, which has been 95.2% for both the past two weeks, is just above the Government's expectation of 95%. Thank you to those parents who have ensured that their child's attendance has improved since I sent letters at the start of this term.

I would once again like to remind you that all requests to take children out of school during term time to visit

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relatives must be made using the Application for Time Off During Term Time form. An email to the school office stating that a family member is unwell so a child will be missing school is not sufficient. This will be recorded as an unauthorised absence and reported to the Local Authority Attendance Officer, who may take further action, including issuing warnings and fixed penalty notices.

Children have a right to an education and an attendance level below 90% means that a child has missed the equivalent of at least a month of school (20 days or more). This obviously has a serious impact on their ability to learn and make progress, but also affects their confidence and friendships.

Finally, congratulations to Year 6 who have once again won the attendance cup. They continue to set a fabulous example to the rest of the school through their excellent attendance.

HALF TERM VALUE - COURAGE

This term in our Values Collective Worship, we have been focusing on Courage. We have been exploring different Bible stories, including David and Goliath and Moses and the Burning Bush. Courage is about being brave, believing in yourself and not giving up even when you are worried or scared.
