Year 5 and Year Author Visit

On Wednesday 27th April, Years 5 & 6 went to St Augustine's High School library to meet the author Graham Whitlock. The children asked some great questions about his experiences as an author and some children purchased signed copies of his book. They really enjoyed the experience. Attendance

I am very concerned by the current level of attendance which, at only 93.2%, continues to be below both our school target and the Government's expectation of 96%. I will be sending letters to the parents of children classed as persistent absentees (children whose attendance is below 90%) next week and arranging meetings with parents to discuss ways to ensure that children's attendance improves.

Children have a right to an education and an attendance level below 90% means that children have missed the equivalent to at least a month of school (20 days or more). This has a very serious impact on their ability to learn and make progress.

Children should not be taken out of school for family holidays and permission will not be given for this. Fixed penalties may be issued for families taking children out of school without permission.

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
