Summer Reading Challenge

We are so proud as a school of our children's love of reading and this has been commented upon by a number of visitors to our school over the past two years, including during the Ofsted Monitoring Visit last June. We are therefore supporting the Westminster Summer Readfing Challenge and want to encourage as many children as possible to take part this year. Please see the details below.

The theme for this year's Summer Reading Challenge is "Gadgeteers," focussing on STEM subjects. It will encourage children not only to read more, but to explore science, technology, engineering, and maths through books and by attending our wide range of themed activities and events happening in all our libraries throughout the holiday.

Evidence shows that children who engage with the Challenge are likely to show an increase and improvement in reading engagement, motivation, confidence, and communication skills.

There is also evidence to show that engagement with the Challenge supports **wellbeing and family connected- ness** - vital in a post pandemic landscape where children are estimated to have lost at least two months of learning in reading and existing inequalities have been amplified.

We hope that we will be able to provide some resources to support the Summer Reading Challenge next week and I strongly encourage you to sign up your child for this wonderful opportrunity over the summer.

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
