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COVID Updates

As I am sure you are aware, COVID cases are beginning to rise again. We are continuing to encourage all members of the school community to maintain social distancing where possible; ensuring good hygiene procedures including regular hand washing/sanitizing and 'catch-it, bin it, kill it; and maintaining good ventilation throughout the school buildings.

If your child has mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat or a slight cough but is otherwise well, DfE guidance states that they can and should continue to attend school. Children who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people, where they can. They can return to school and resume normal activities when they no longer have a high temperature and they are well enough to attend school.

Secondary Transfer Meeting - Thursday 13th October

The closing date for applications to secondary schools for 2022 is Monday 31st October. Parents of children in Year 6 **must** submit an application form by this time, otherwise your child will not be considered for a place until after everyone else has accepted their places in March or April of next year. This is also the procedure you must follow if you are applying for a place at St Augustine's CE High School. The easiest way to make your application is online. If you need any help with this process, please see Mrs Laouar or Mrs Wiggins.

To help you to make your application, we have arranged a meeting about the process for applying for Secondary school places on Thursday 13th October at 3:45pm in the school hall. At this meeting, an Admissions Manager for Westminster will explain how to make an online application and will be able to answer any questions that you have about the process.

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Author Visit - Jess Butterworth


