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Appointments Should Not be Made During the School Day

I explained in the last newsletter that appointments for your child to see a doctor, dentist or optician must be made outside the school day and that the only appointments that children are permitted to attend during the school day are hospital appointments or other specialist appointments. All other appointments must be made for after school hours or during the holidays. If you do take your child out of school during the day for anything other than a hospital appointment, this will be marked as an unauthorised absence.

Clubs Payments

Please ensure that you have paid in full for any after-school clubs that your child is attending this term (and last term, if still unpaid). Unfortunately, we will not be able to offer places to children for next term if this term's payments are not paid in full. Please contact the office if you need to check what you owe.

Black Shoes or Trainers

Despite many reminders in newsletters, there are still some children who are wearing trainers with coloured markings, or in colours other than black. Our uniform policy clearly states that shoes and trainers must be all black. If your child does come to school in shoes or trainers that are not black, you will receive a text or call asking you to make sure that your child is wearing the correct colour trainers the next day. If a child continues to wear the wrong colour trainers after this, we will be calling and asking you to bring in another pair of shoes for your child. If you are having problems finding black shoes for your child, please speak to the member of SLT on the gate or call the office. Thank you to the majority of parents who do ensure that their children have the correct footwear.
